Introduction

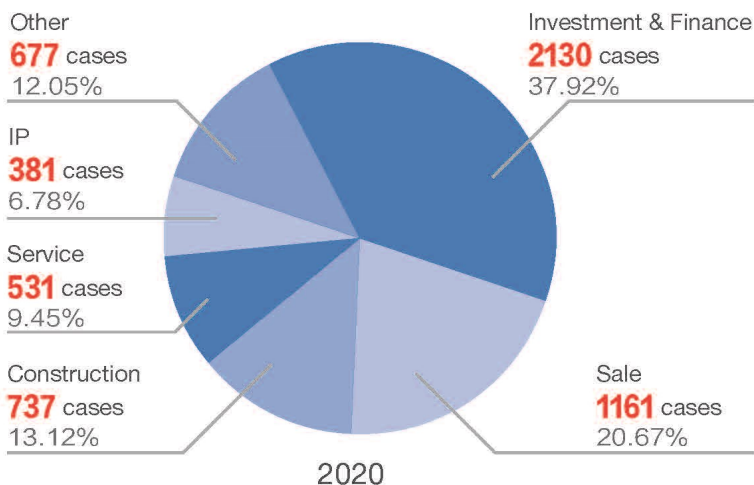
The Beijing Arbitration Commission, also known as the Beijing International Arbitration Center (the BAC/BIAC), was established on 28 September 1995. The BAC/BIAC is run by the Committee comprising of 11 members, who are elected from reputable experts in law, economy and trade. The members of the Seventh Committee of the BAC/BIAC are as followed: Chairperson, Prof. Liang Huixing; Vice Chairperson, Dr. Li Fuying, Mr. Zhou Jidong and Madame Wang Hongsong; Committee Member, Prof. Che Pizhao, Prof. Li Shuguang, Mr. Lin Weimin, Mr. Liu Guoyuan, Prof. Wang Liming, Prof. Xu Chuanxi and Mr. Lin Zhiwei. Over the past two decades, the BAC/BIAC has become a leading arbitration institution in China with an international reputation for its independence, impartiality, professionalism and efficiency. Since 2013, the Commercial Dispute Resolution in China: An Annual Review and Preview has become a major source of information concerning the dispute resolution practice in China for practitioners at home and abroad, and has been highly recognized by experts in the industry. The BAC/BIAC has been invited as an observer for the UNCITRAL Working Group II since 2017. The BAC/BIAC was recommended as one of the arbitration institutions within the “one-stop” diversified international commercial dispute resolution platform established by the China International Commercial Court in 2018. The BAC/BIAC released Investment Arbitration Rules in 2019, which endeavors to provide a Chinese approach in response to investor-state dispute settlement reform. The BAC/BIAC also provides other alternative dispute resolution services such as commercial mediation and construction dispute board.

Advantages

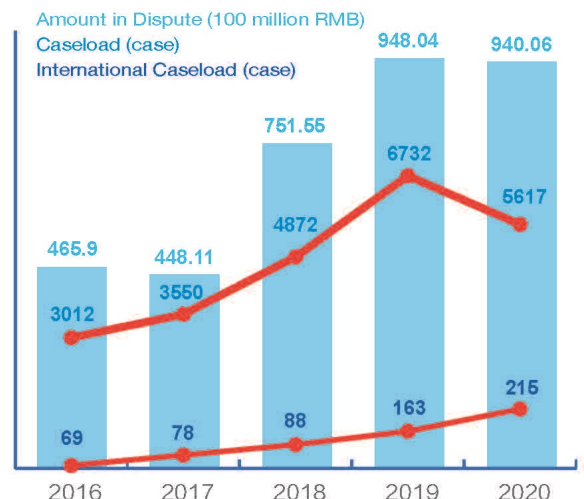
- * As of December 31, 2020, 50,814 cases were filed with the BAC/BIAC. The total value in dispute under these cases amounts to RMB 525.22 billion. The BAC/BIAC possess extensive experiences in handling different types of commercial disputes.
- * Parties involved in the BAC/BIAC administered cases are from 55 jurisdictions to date.
- * In the past three years, the average duration to conclude a BAC/BIAC administered arbitration case is 92 days, reflecting the BAC/BIAC’s effective dispute resolution service.
- * Foreign lawyers are allowed to represent parties in arbitration cases administered by the BAC/BIAC.
- * Arbitration fees of the BAC/BIAC are comparatively lower than other international arbitration institutions.
- * The BAC/BIAC is the first arbitration institution to adopt the international fee schedule in mainland China. Arbitration fees are divided into arbitrator’s fees and administration fees. Arbitrators may charge on an hourly basis for arbitrator’s fees. These approaches will better serve the parties to manage the cost of arbitration.

Over decades, the Vis Moot and Vis East have earned recognition as an educational exercise bringing together arbitration professionals to meet and get acquainted in a truly international exchange. The gatherings have of course morphed over the past years since our abrupt transition from face-to-face to virtual format. We've done our best to provide on-line opportunities to "meet and greet", with the help of our wonderful sponsors. And of course, we hope that for Vis East 20 next year, the Covid restrictions will be history and we'll celebrate with all our Mooties in person.

As always, our Mooties have earned their wings through hard work, dedication and persistence. On behalf of the Department of Justice, a very warm welcome to the 19th edition of the Vis (East) Moot, which is also the 3rd edition of the Virtual Vis (East) Moot – an important annual event for law students around the world to gain valuable exposure and practical experience in international law and arbitration, enhancing their knowledge in research and advocacy.

Since its inception in Vienna in 1994, the Vis Moot has been well received and become one of the largest competitive and social events for law students, coaches and arbitrators worldwide. Since 2004, the Moot has expanded its success in Asia, as the Vis (East) Moot in Hong Kong, which is a sister moot to the Vis Moot. The Vis (East) Moot attracts participation of teams from all over the world every year providing law students with an opportunity to put their skills to practice in one of the largest commercial arbitration moot.

In 2020, as a result of the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Vis (East) Moot's successful transition to a remote online mode showcased the Vis East Moot Foundation's amazing passion, commitment and innovation in promoting international arbitration and the Vis (East) Moot.

As we all know, the COVID-19 has upended our world. Despite the difficult times, every society in the world has, to a certain extent, adjusted itself to the new normal where technology has never been more important. As a leading centre for international legal and dispute resolution services in the Asia Pacific region, Hong Kong has endeavoured to strike a balance between containing the pandemic and resumption of social activities. In line with the global trend, we have stepped up with the development and application of technology in the provision of legal services. In collaboration with international organisations, Hong Kong, China opted into the APEC Collaborative Framework for Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) in April 2020 to promote the use of ODR for micro, small and medium-sized enterprises in APEC economies. INTRODUCING THE MOOT

The Vis Moot was the brainchild of three law professors who wanted to encourage the use of the then brand new Convention on the International Sale of Goods. It was the first private law international moot and the first arbitration moot set in Vienna the home of UNCITRAL. The Moot began in 1992-1993 with 9 teams and has expanded to approximately 380 competing law schools today. To ensure that every Moot participant benefits from an international intercultural experience, there are no national or regional elimination rounds. Thus many teams may compete from the same jurisdiction. This year at Vis East there are 24 Chinese mainland teams, 11 Americans and 21 Indian schools plus 36 other jurisdiction represented.

The goal of the Vis East Moot is to share with the original Vis Moot in Vienna the promotion and study of international commercial arbitration and to train tomorrow's legal leaders in methods of alternate dispute resolution.

Because of the international business community's marked preference for arbitration as the means for resolving trans-border commercial disputes, the Vis Moot was created as a clinical tool for training law students in the crucial aspects of the procedure: research, analysis, drafting and advocacy. Student teams read and analyse the facts and evidence of a case, identify the legal issues seek out the relevant legal texts, craft their legal arguments, draft memoranda for the claimant and respondent, and argue orally on the basis of those memoranda before an international tribunal of experts.

Each year, the problem involves consideration of the UNCITRAL Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG) and other commercial law, in the context of arbitration. The rules under which the arbitration is conducted change each year. This year the rules of Asian International Arbitration Center govern the arbitration procedure.

The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (CI Arb) was founded in 1915, "*to promote and facilitate worldwide the determination of disputes by arbitration and alternative means of private dispute resolution other than resolution by the court.*"

The Institute achieves its objectives through its close to 30,000 members worldwide, supported by a network of 41 branches. The East Asia Branch (EAB) was founded as the Hong Kong Branch in 1972. It now has close to 2,700 members, with around 1,800 members residing in Hong Kong. In the Hong Kong SAR, the EAB is a registered charity under section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance (Cap 112).

The EAB is the largest branch of the Institute, covering the region comprising the north, from Mongolia, Mainland China, South Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Myanmar, Vietnam, down to the south, Philippines and Indonesia. Chapters have been established in Indonesia, Philippines, Vietnam, Taiwan, Japan and South Korea

Our objective is to provide a regional organization for members of the Institute (Chartered Arbitrator, Fellows, Members and Associates) residing in East Asia, including over 1,000 young members in the Young Members Group (YMG) which continues to shine through networking and activities for students, fresh graduates and young professionals across the Branch. YMG Chapters have been launched in Taiwan and the Philippines, very recently in Japan on 28 September 2021, and one planned for Indonesia. The third EAB YMG Conference was held virtually in November/ December 2021.

The role of the EAB is to promote and represent the Institute and its services - arbitration and ADR - and to uphold the standards of the Institute in East Asia. The EAB achieves this through local and international media, and by direct contact with the public, local professionals, businesses and arbitral and educational organizations.

2021/2022 has continued to be a challenging year during the pandemic, but we have continued to organize training courses and member activities throughout the EAB. Almost all have been virtual, and this has been a benefit to those members who cannot always travel nor access the usual face-to-face events.

The EAB has also collaborated with other organizations such as the HKIAC and the DoJ in various activities in the region to promote Hong Kong as an international dispute resolution centre. The Branch also promotes diversity and inclusion through specific events.

May I take this opportunity to wish you all a very enjoyable virtual visit to Hong Kong and the best of luck for all participating teams in the Moot! While you may not be here in person, I trust you will enjoy the experience of being an integral part of Hong Kong's dispute resolution hub.

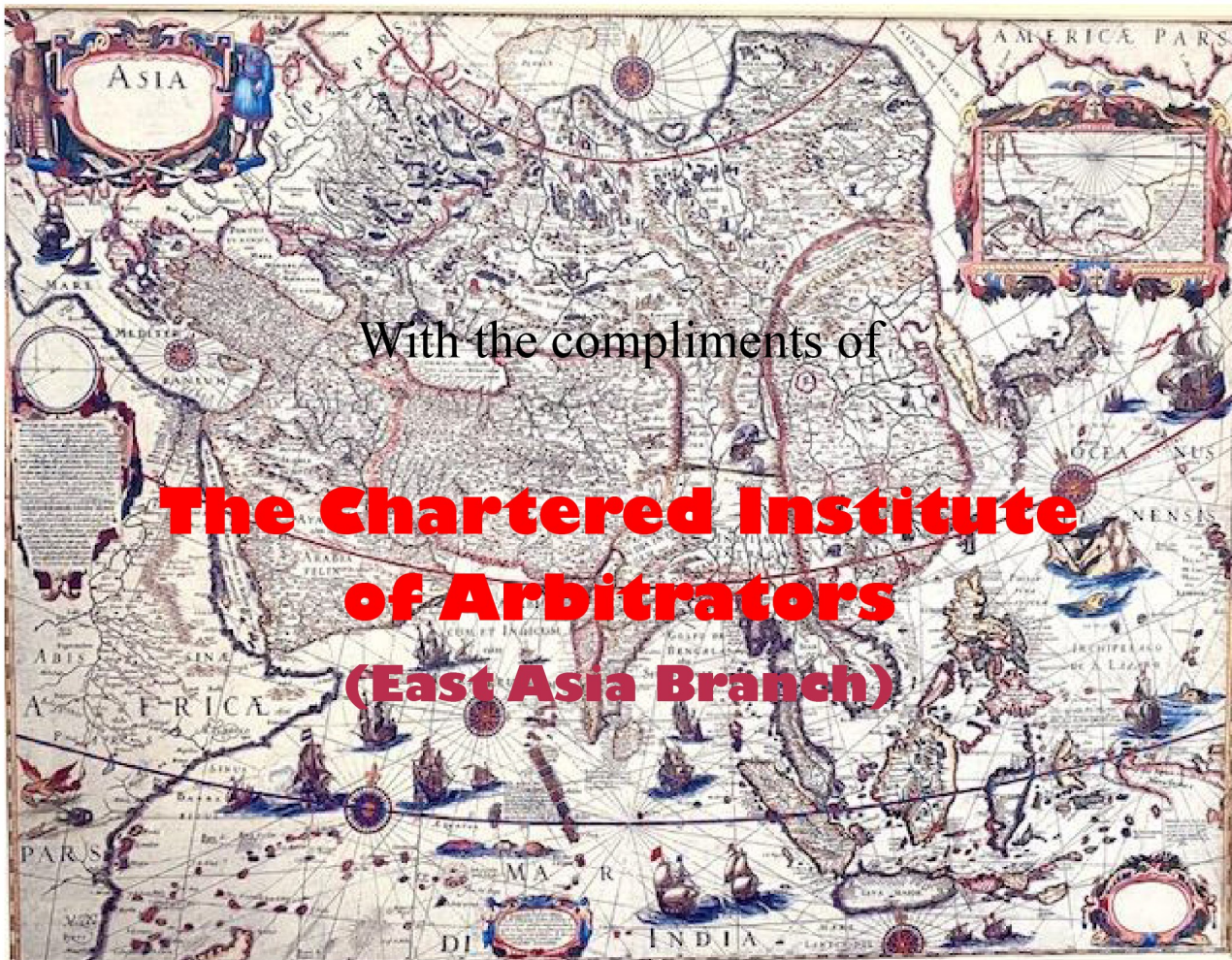
